A nursery rhyme is a traditional rhyming poem or song. Teaching nursery rhymes to children helps them to develop auditory skills and helps with speech development.

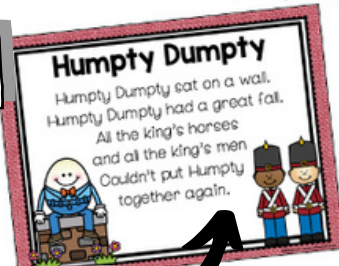
### Objective:

Students will develop listening and speaking skills by reciting a poem.

### Activities:

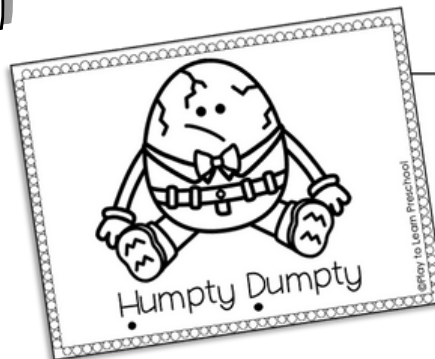
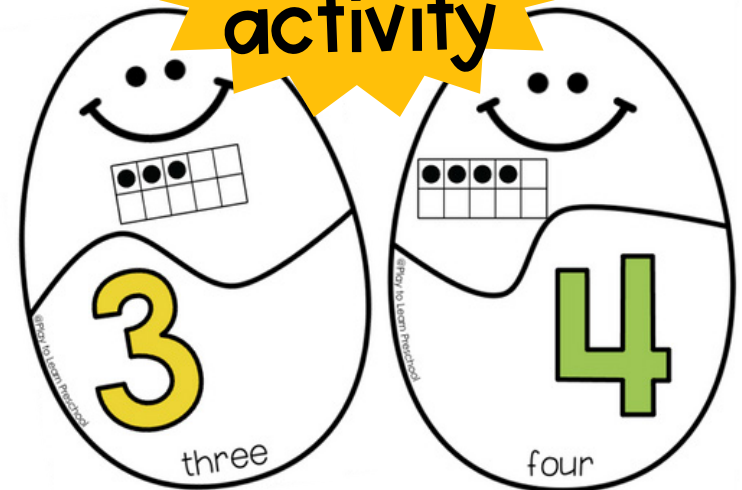
1. Read the poem to the students and invite the children to join you in reading it again.
2. Reenact the poem with props. Use small blocks to build a wall and a plastic Easter egg (draw a face on it for fun) for Humpty. As the class recites the poem, the students can take turns putting Humpty on the wall and then making him fall off of it!


