

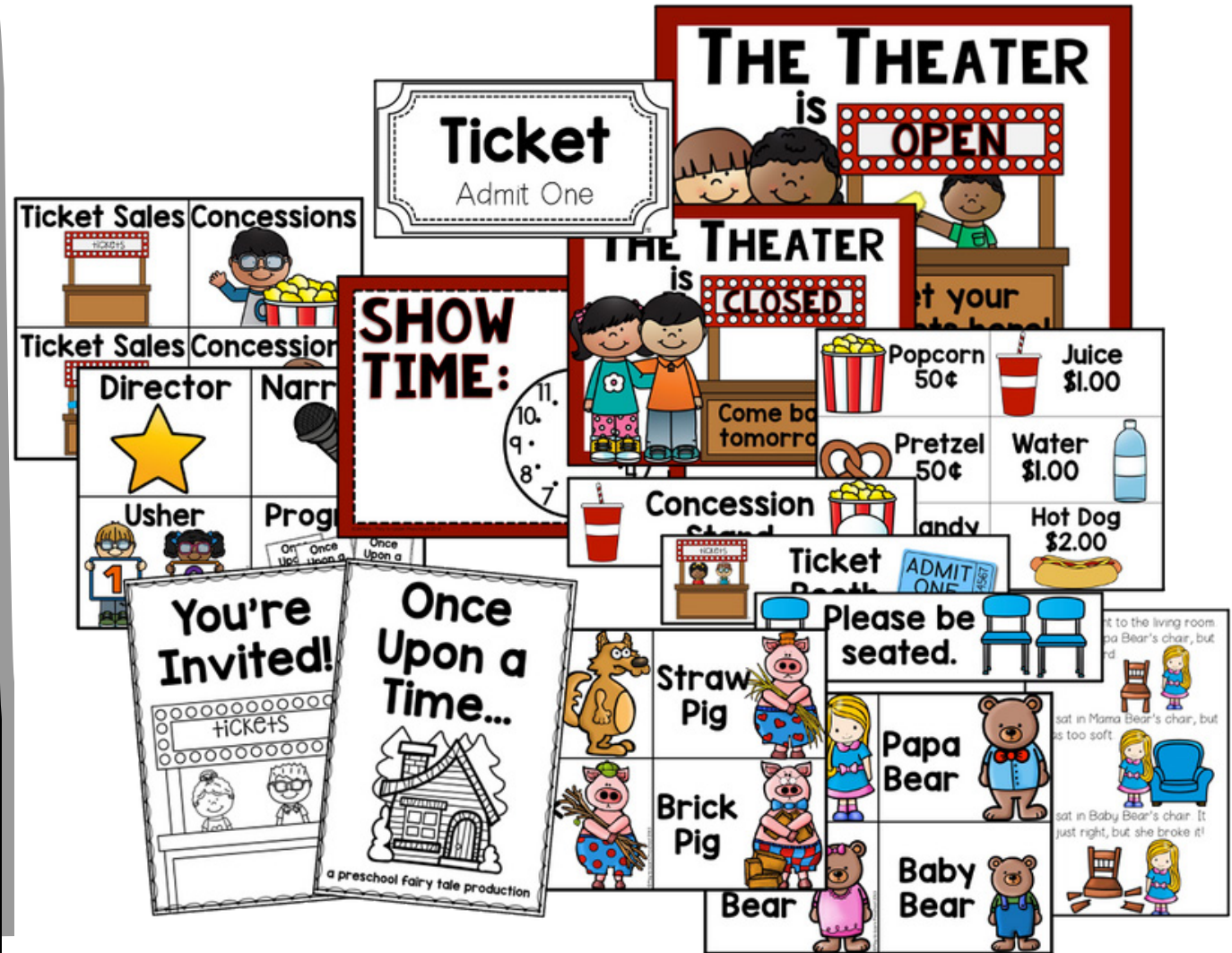

"Not I," said the pig.

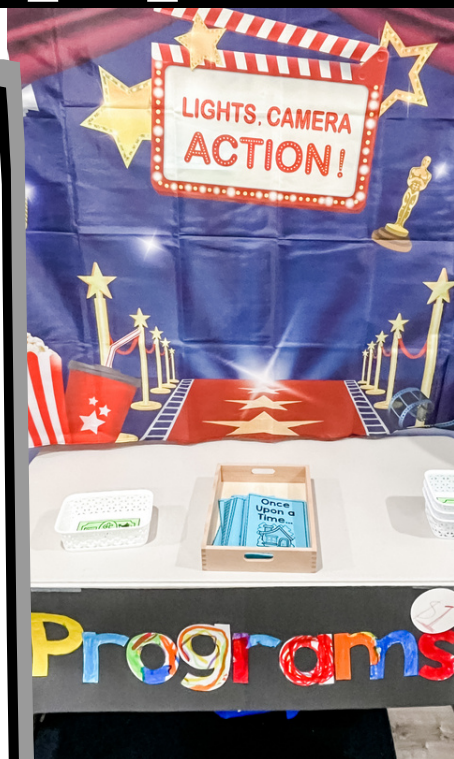
