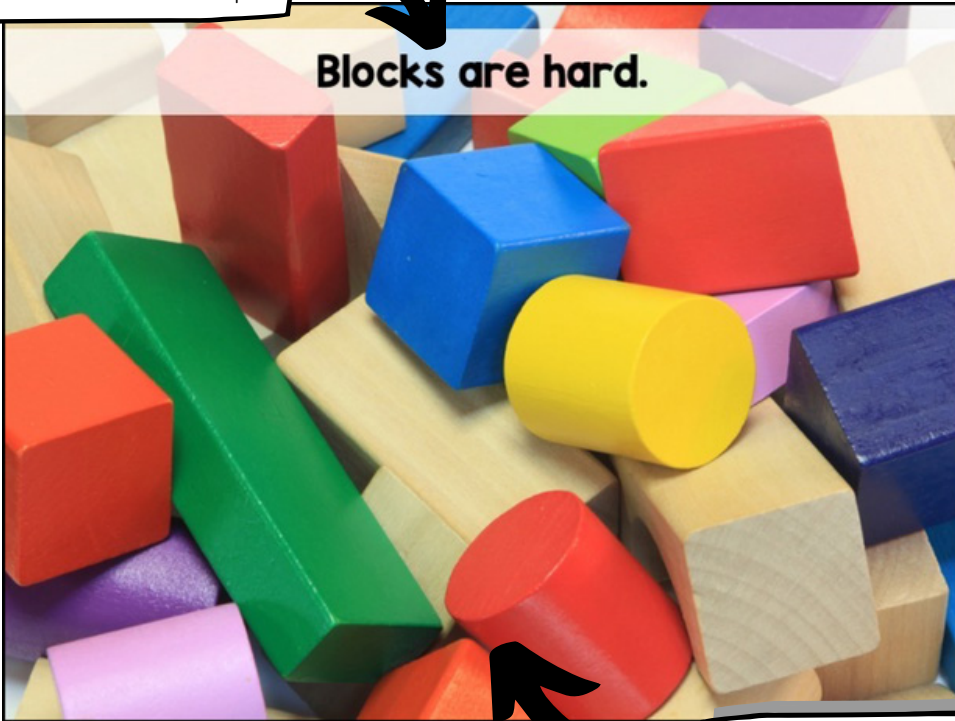

- opposite of hard



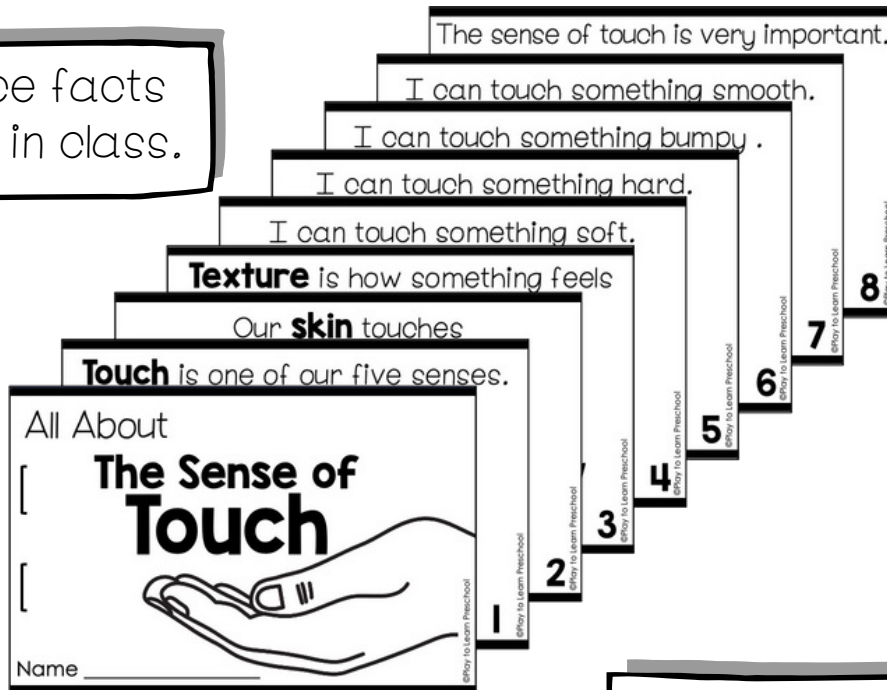
