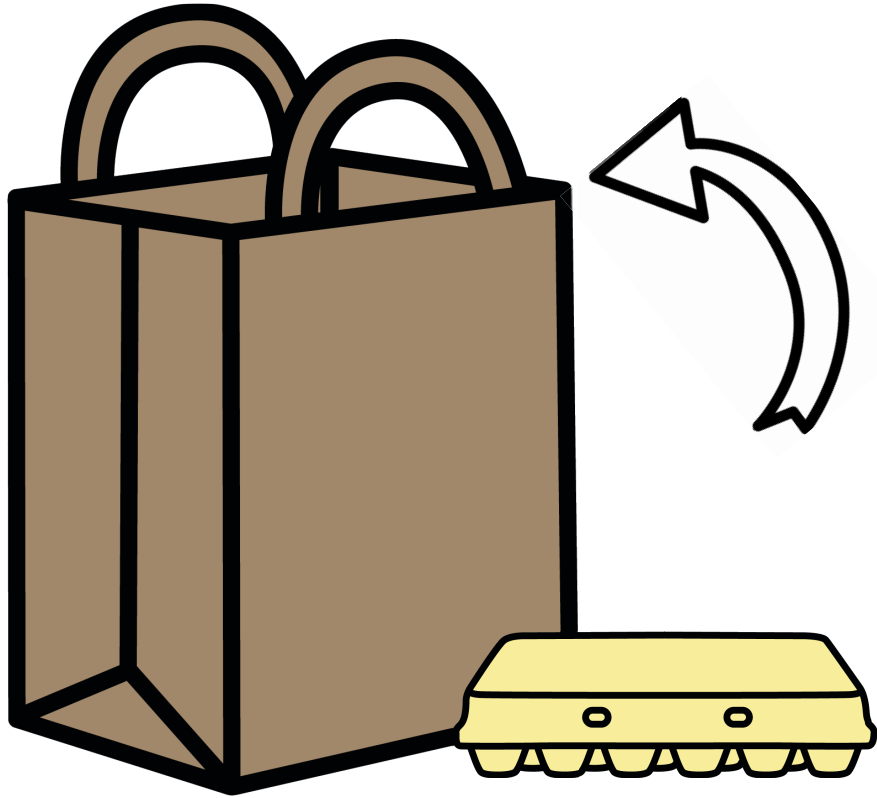
First, place heavy items and jars in the bottom of the bag.

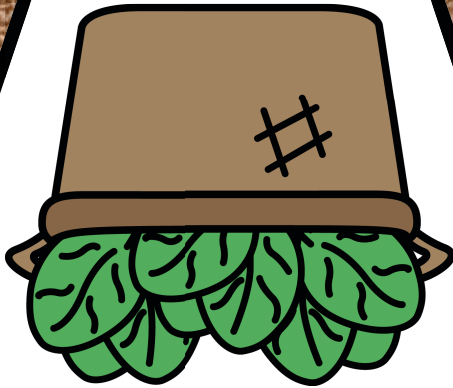

Finally, at the last table, Betsy saw her favorite food, berries!



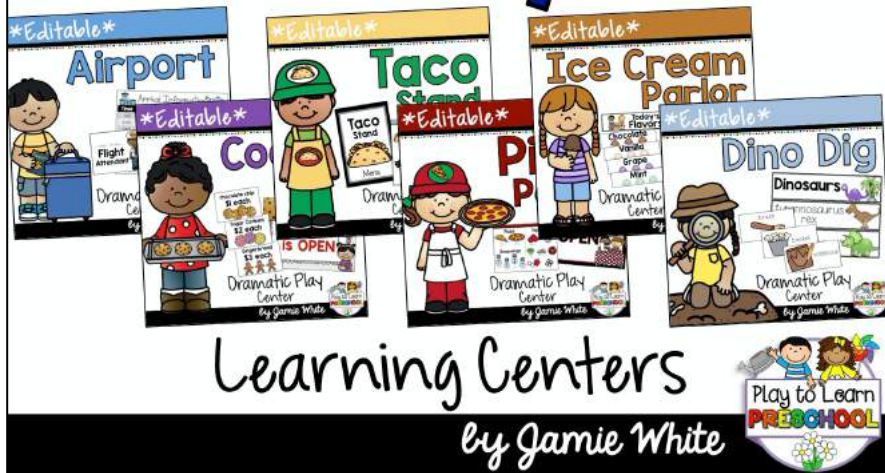
Betsy had such a fun time at the farmer's market. She took the fresh food to her grandma's house and couldn't wait to have soup later that day. **8**
