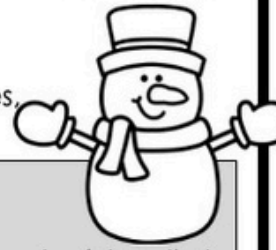


Snowman Beginning Sounds

This hands-on winter literacy activity helps young learners connect letters and sounds in a meaningful way. Children build snowmen by matching beginning sounds, letter names, and pictures, while also strengthening fine motor skills.



Learning Objectives:

Beginning Sounds and Letter Recognition

Students will identify uppercase and lowercase letters and connect them to pictures that begin with the same sound, improving early phonics and alphabet knowledge.

Fine Motor Development

Students will strengthen hand muscles and coordination by connecting snowman pieces with links or manipulatives, supporting skills needed for writing and classroom tasks.

Preparation:

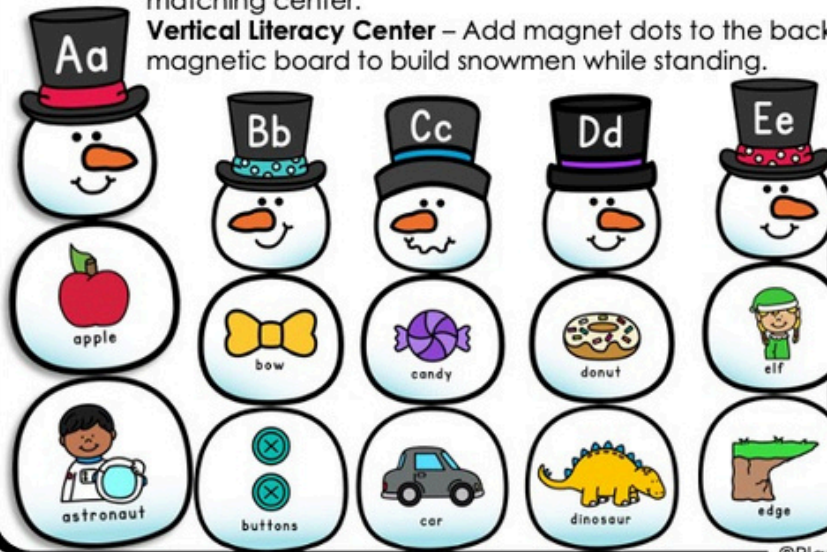
- **Print** the snowman pieces on cardstock.
- **Laminate** for durability and repeated use.
- **Cut** out the snowman heads, middle sections, and bases.

How to Use:

Students choose a snowman head and find the matching picture or letters to build a complete snowman, connecting the pieces with links or matching them on a flat surface.

Other Fun Uses:

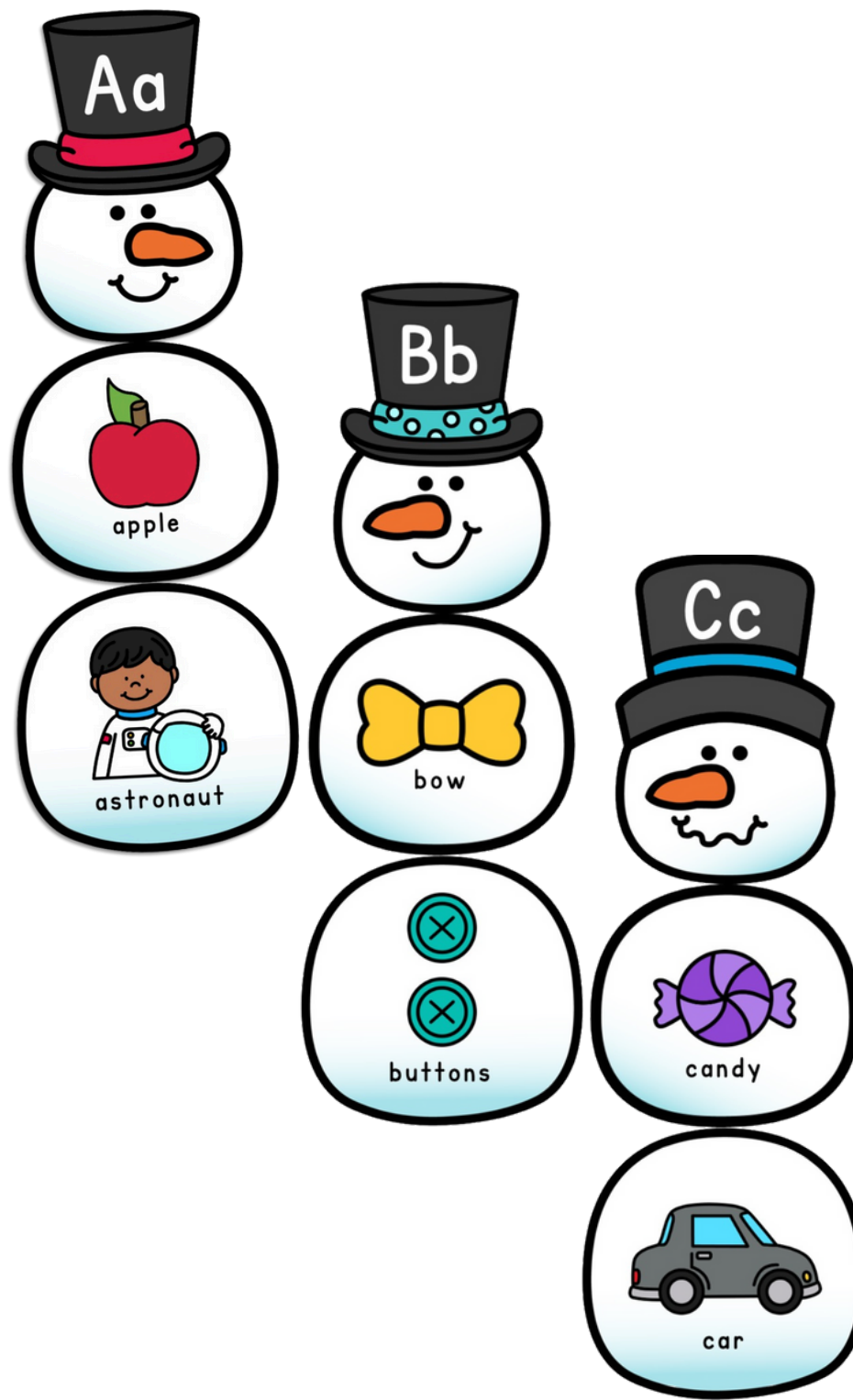
- **Fine Motor Linking** – Punch holes in the pieces and connect the snowman parts with plastic links for a challenging fine motor activity.
- **File Folder Match** – Place the pieces in a file folder for an independent matching center.
- **Vertical Literacy Center** – Add magnet dots to the back and use on a magnetic board to build snowmen while standing.



Storage Tips:

Store snowman pieces in a small bin or zippered bag. Linked sets can be kept together on a ring or hook for easy setup and cleanup.

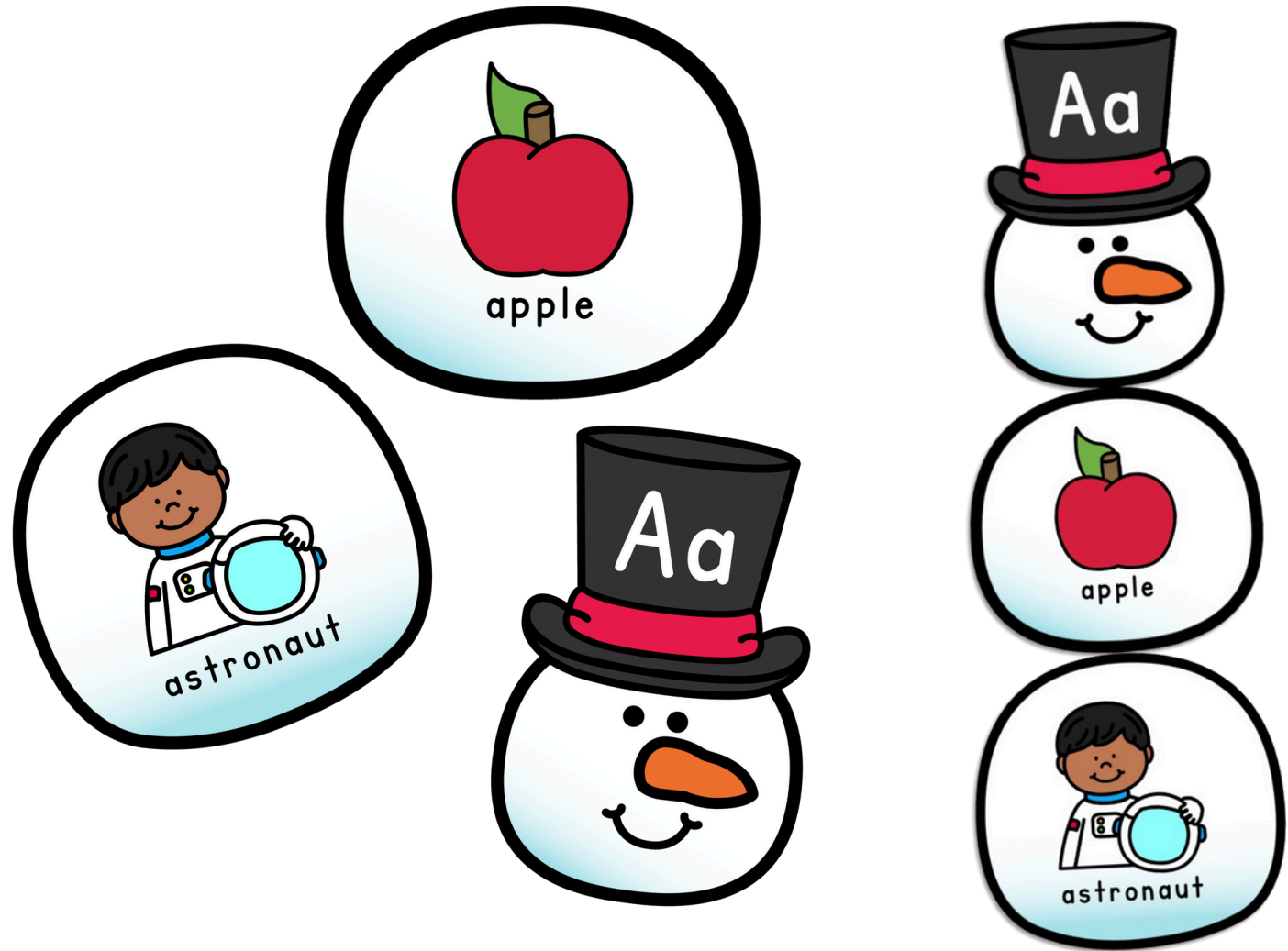

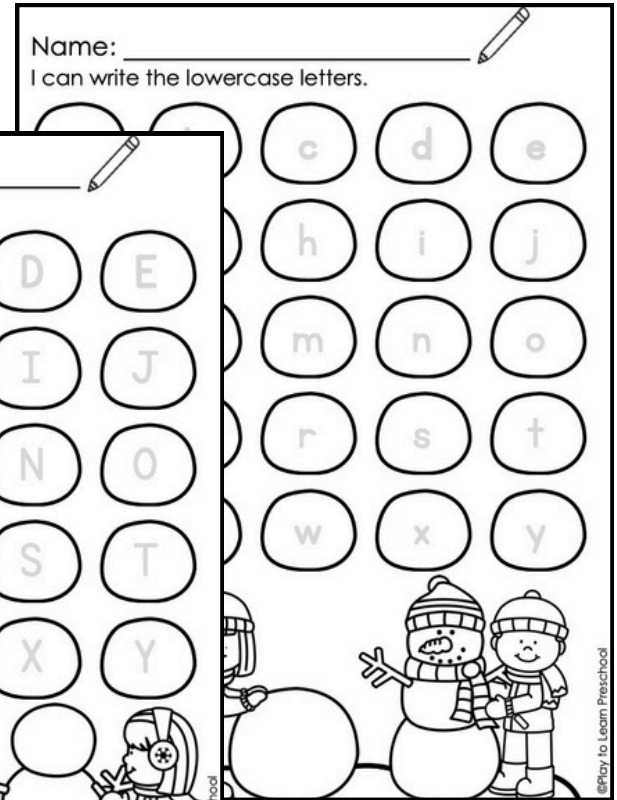
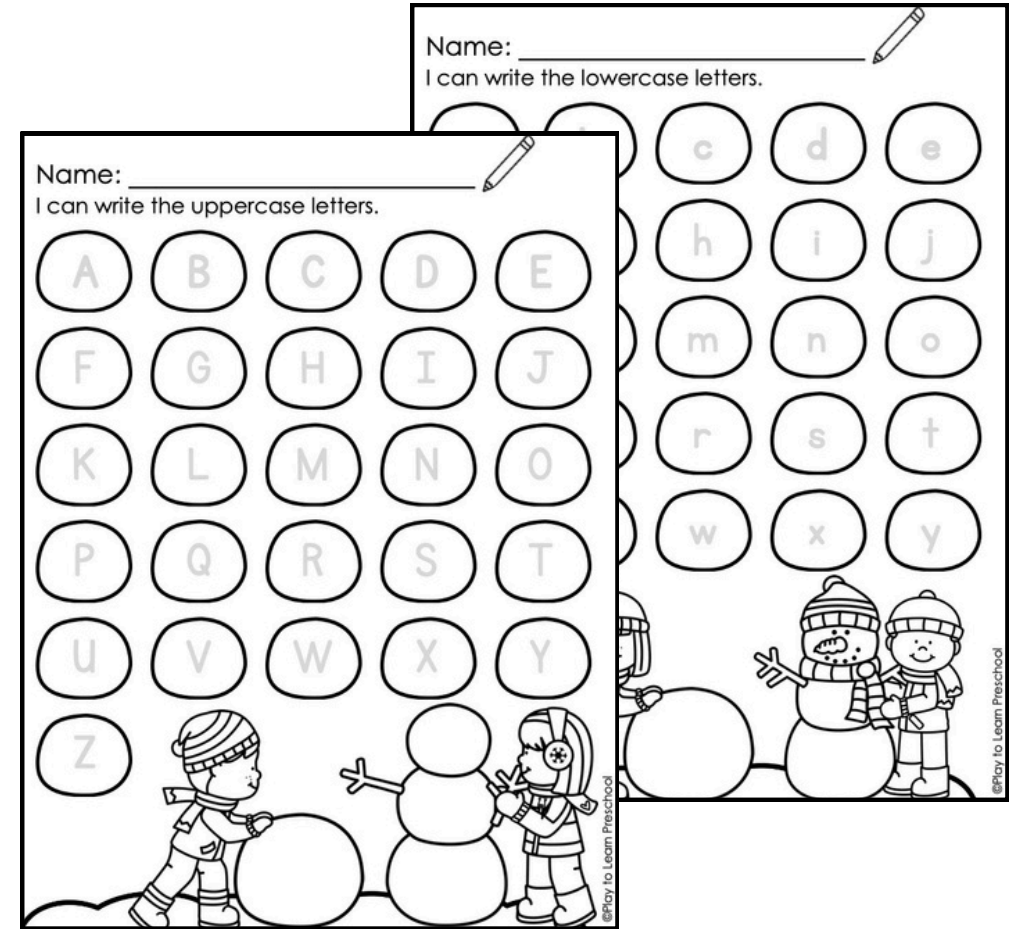
